Legality of Trident under question

THE Ministry of Defence, headed by Sir Michael Fallon, has been asked by Phillip Hammond to make a saving of £300 million in order to pay for yet another cost overrun on the Trident programme.

Trident is unusable but it is kept because most of our politicians think it gives the UK a status

they find hard to give up. The legality of Trident is rarely discussed.

So several groups in the UK, including one I belong to in Sevenoaks, applied to their local magistrates courts to have the Prime Minister and Defence Secretary prosecuted for conspiracy to commit a war crime by the threat to use Trident against a city like Moscow.

Planning to commit a war crime is a war crime in itself. The court case requires the consent of the Attorney General before it can commence, but he hasn't yet given a decision despite being first asked to give it 20 months ago.

His silence is denying the public knowledge about the legality of the most expensive item in the UK's armoury.

Does he think that the public cannot be trusted with this information?
